The California-based College Futures Foundation has approved a \$367,000 grant to the **Institute for Evidence-Based Change (IEBC)** to support management transition of **Caring Campus California** to the **California Community College Classified Senate (4CS)** and implement training programs for California community college professional classified staff to lead and institutionalize Caring Campus initiatives at their campuses, improving their student success outcomes.

Classified Leadership Institute Returns

In June, over 200 classified professionals gathered in-person once again to learn and share together. Keynote speaker, **Joe Britto**, led interactive sessions on *The Six Attributes of a Leadership Mindset* to encourage participants to develop a new way of approaching leadership and apply that to the challenges they often face.

Other keynote sessions included **Brad Phillips** from IEBC speaking on Caring Campus. **Dr.Siria Martinez**, Assistant Vice Chancellor of Student Equity and Success and **Dr. Tonya Williams** wrapped up the conference by having a conversation on building equity conscious professional learning experiences and career pathways with and for classified professionals.

Throughout the conference, participants were led by classified professionals from across the state in over 30 breakout sessions. These ranged from participatory governance to professional growth as well as COVID fatigue and stress.
